

**TOWNSHIP OF MILLBURN
ORDINANCE NO. 2521-18
ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER VII "TRAFFIC", SECTION 7-20
"STOP INTERSECTIONS" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP
OF MILLBURN**

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: *The proposed amendment to the Traffic Ordinance is to authorize the installation of "all way" stop signs at the intersections of Hobart Avenue and Highland Avenue. This "all way" stop has been recommended by the Township of Millburn's traffic consultant, Maser Consulting.*

WHEREAS, the Township of Millburn traffic consultant, Maser Consulting, has recommended that 7-20 "Stop Intersections" be amended to establish an "all way" stop at the intersections of Hobart Avenue and Highland Avenue; and

WHEREAS, this recommendation comes from concerns regarding the safety of the intersection after reviewing crash data, traffic counts and other relevant data.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MILLBURN, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter VII entitled "Traffic" of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Millburn, Part I, "On Street Traffic Regulations," Section 7-20, "Stop Intersections," is hereby amended and supplemented to include the following additional intersection:

Intersection

STOP Sign on:

Hobart Avenue and Highland Avenue

All Way

*STOP SIGN, Type R1-1 (30"), shall be installed on Highland Avenue facing northbound and southbound traffic, approaching the intersections of Highland Avenue and Hobart Avenue.

Section 2. With the addition of the above language, the remainder of Section 7-20, "Stop Intersections" of Chapter VII, "Traffic," Part I, "On Street Traffic Regulations" shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable and the invalidity of any phrase, clause or part of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remainder of the Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication as provided by law.
