

MILLBURN OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY / DISASTER

TO ALL CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF MILLBURN, NEW JERSEY; AND TO ALL DEPARTMENTS, DIVISIONS, BUREAUS OF THE TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT OF MILLBURN, NEW JERSEY.

Emergency Directive 2020-05

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested in me by (Chapter 251 of the laws of 1942, as amended and supplemented, N.J.S.A. App A:9-30 et. seq.; N.J.S.A. 40:48-1(6), and ordinances enacted pursuant thereto; N.J.S.A. 2C 33-1 et. seq.; whichever law or laws apply, it is declared that a local Emergency/Disaster exists within the Township of Millburn; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid laws authorize the promulgation of such orders, rules and regulations, as are necessary to meet the various problems which have or may be presented by such an Emergency/Disaster; and

WHEREAS, On May 13th, 2020 Governor Murphy made an announcement that municipalities may open non-essential construction, curbside pick-up at non-essential retail businesses that will take effect at 0600 hours on Monday, May18th, 2020 and car gatherings for the purpose of drive through and drive in events will take effect immediately, and

WHEREAS, The Mall at Short Hills and other non-essential retail businesses in the Township will be permitted to provide curbside pick-up only no sooner than Monday, May 18th at 0600 hours in accordance with Executive Order 142. More guidance can be found at; and

WHEREAS, Non-essential retail stores may reopen for online or phone ordering and curbside pickup at 6 a.m. on Monday, May 18, 2020. Non-essential retail businesses that open for curbside pickup must adopt the following social policies:

- Customers can pick up goods outside of an establishment that they have already ordered but cannot enter the brick-and-mortar premises;
- Where possible, limit in-store operations to those employees who are responsible for the operations required for curbside pickup;
- Where possible, handle customer transactions in advance by phone, email, fax, or other means that avoid person-to-person contact;

- Where possible, customers shall notify the retailer by text message, email, or phone once they arrive, or make best efforts to schedule their arrival time in advance. The customer shall be asked to remain in their vehicle, if arriving by car, until store staff delivers the purchase;
- Where possible, designated employees shall bring goods outside of the retail establishment and place the goods directly in a customer's vehicle; and

NOW THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH the aforesaid laws, we do hereby
